There is a complex relationship between the two and unresolved sensory issues can hinder the ability of parents/caregivers and children to resolve attachment issues.

This workshop explains emotional and other impacts, risk factors and warning signs for Sensory Processing Disorders and offers practical interventions for parents and caregivers.
