

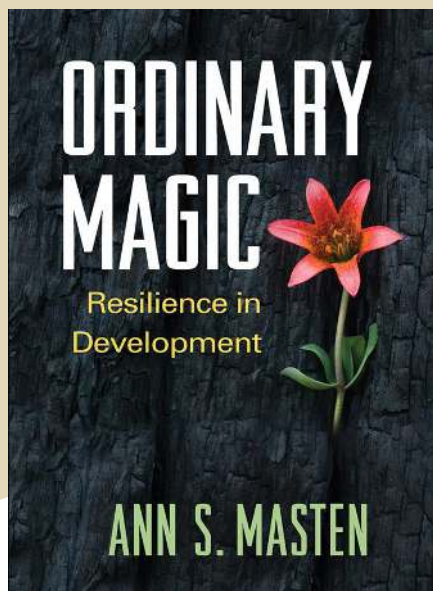

Dr. Masten will highlight findings from decades of development research on resilience that illuminate how children adapt successfully to adversities and challenges. She will identify key drivers of resilience in the lives of children implicated by research, including systems in the mind and body, as well as relationships, and protective processes linked to schools, communities, and cultures. She will discuss how the “ordinary magic” of resilience is nurtured and present a resilience framework for action, illustrated with practical examples. New horizons in resilience science will be discussed, including neurobiological and cultural processes, along with interventions that target multiple systems and generations.

Ann S. Masten, Ph.D. is a highly-esteemed, developmental psychologist and has been at the forefront of resilience theory and research for decades. She is a Regents Professor and Irving B. Harris Professor of Child Development at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. Her work in resilience in human development, particularly in the context of poverty, homelessness, war, disaster, and migration is recognized internationally. Dr. Masten is a past President of the Society for Research in Child Development, recipient of numerous honors, and author of more than 200 publications, including the 2014 book, *Ordinary Magic: Resilience in Development*.
