



Bonnie Halpern-Felsher, PhD, FSAHM

Dr. Halpern-Felsher is a professor of pediatrics and adolescent medicine and a developmental psychologist at Stanford University School of Medicine. She is a world expert in adolescent decision-making and risk-taking behaviors. Funded by the NIH (National Institutes of Health) and many foundations, her research has focused on understanding and reducing adolescent and young adult tobacco use, alcohol and marijuana use, and risky sexual behavior. Her research, including about 200 publications in journals such as JAMA Network, Pediatrics, and the American Journal of Public Health, as well as her committee and policy work, have been instrumental in setting policy at the local, state, and national level.
